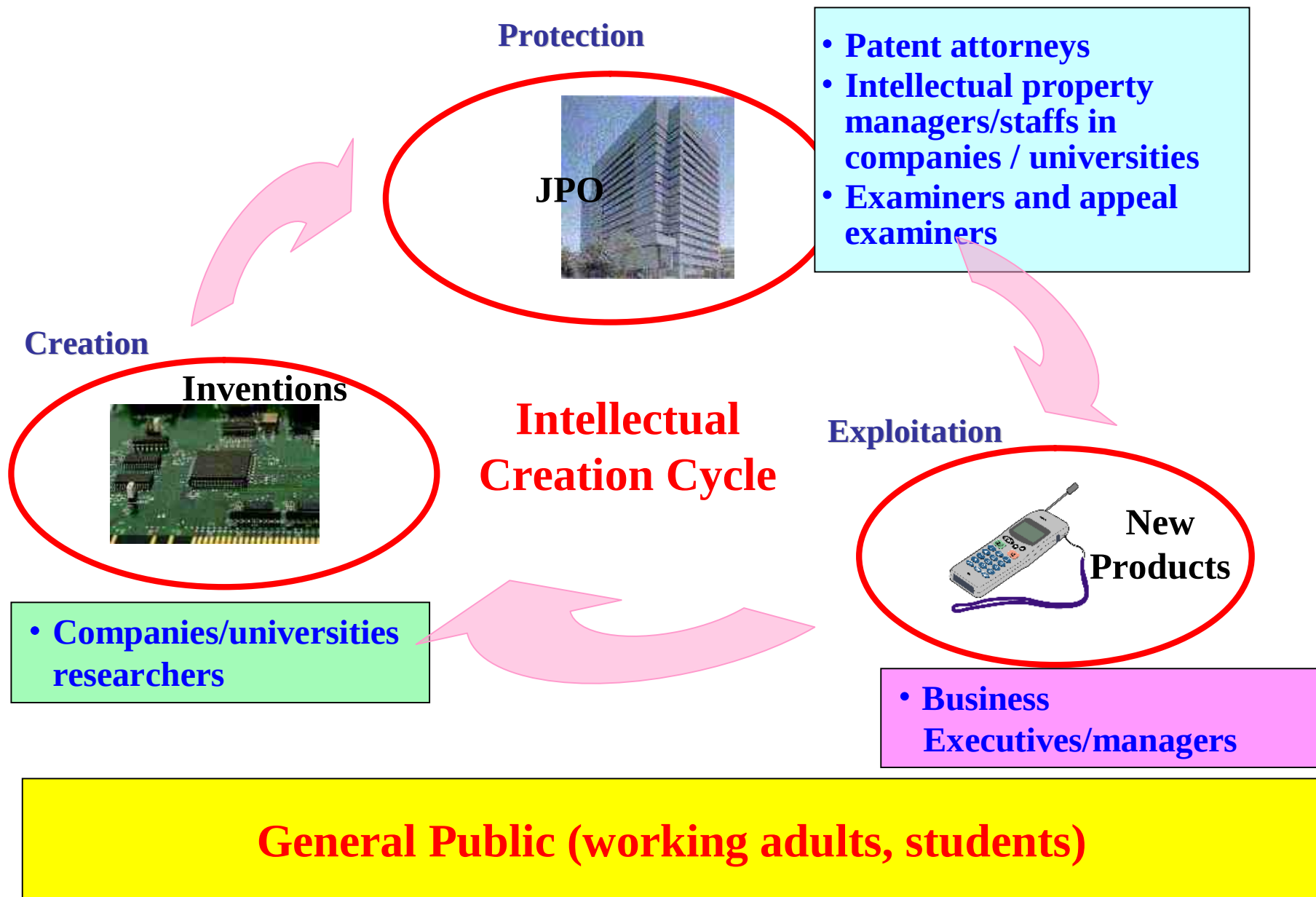

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4. Comprehensive Strategy for IP-Related HRD

The most important element for IP-based nation:
Development of Human Resources

Lack of Quantity

[Further increase the number of IP-related human resources]

Lack of Quality

[Advance and broaden the skills of IP-related human resources]

It should be noted that;

1. It will take a long time to develop human resources.
2. Combined efforts of educational/training institutions should be made.
3. Comprehensive and well-planned measures should be provided to meet requirements of “varieties of HRs”

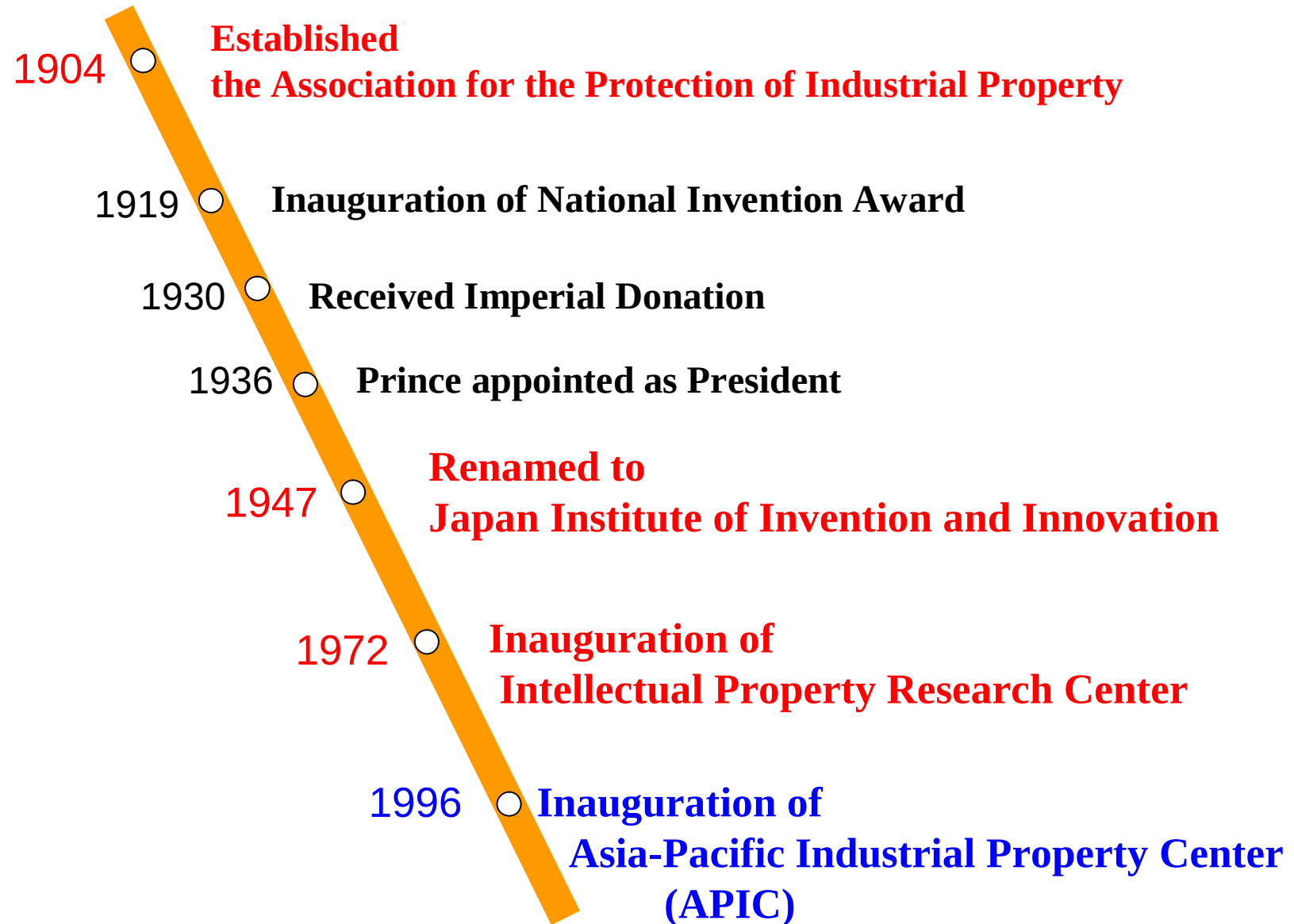
1885 : Patent Monopoly Act enacted

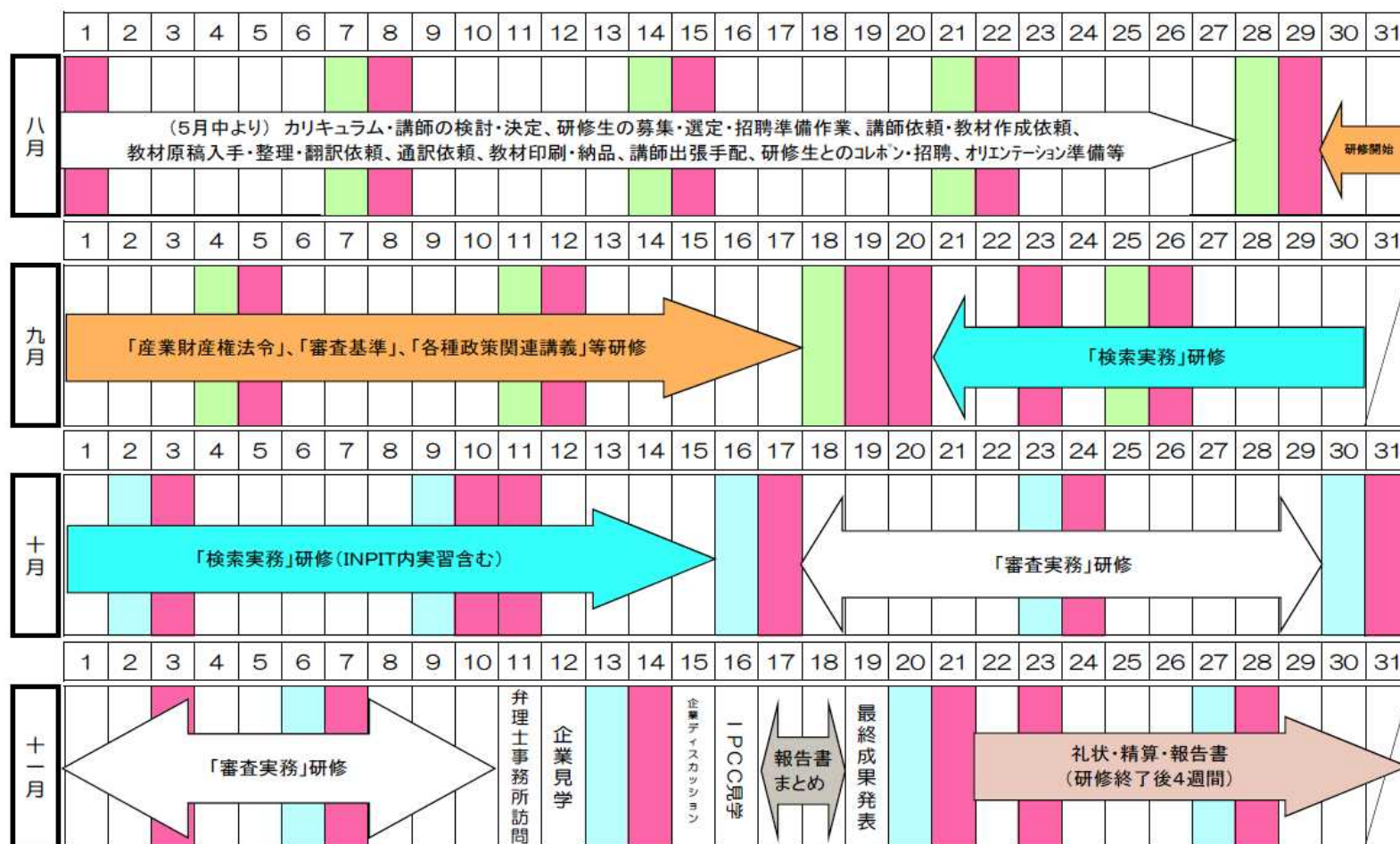
